
ASSESSMENTS

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WHAT TO BRING

Things You Need:

- Sleeping bag & pillow
- Air mattress/Cots (optional)
- Towel and necessities for showers
- Riding clothes and Hard-soled boots (no tennis shoes for riding)
- Casual clothes if desired
- Toiletries
- Riding Helmet (unless waiver is signed)
- Horse manual and notebook (Level Assessments available upon request) Horse manual is required for assessment.

Things Your Horse Needs:

- Feed (hay & grain)
- Stalls will be available
- Hay net & water bucket
- Grooming tools
- Stall cleaning items (some wheel-barrows available)
- Saddle & Tack (Show items not necessary)

Workshop Descriptions

EVENING EVENTS/ACTIVITIES: This will include games and demonstrations. Weather permitting there will be a trail ride.

EQUITATION: Instruction will be given in western equitation and pattern execution. Work on seat and hand position will be stressed as well as leads and other techniques needed for completing assessments. Instruction will be based on the level of Horsemanship you are currently assessed.

HORSEMANSHIP/RIDING: Sessions will emphasize training both young and older horses to become your partner in whatever discipline of riding you are interested in.

HALTER NOSE BANDS AND POPPERS: (Hands-on class): Create your own nose band, popper, or saddle charm by stamping your design onto leather.

TRAIL & RANCH SKILLS: Learn to maneuver your horse through obstacles both on the ground and in the saddle. These skills will be useful in both trail and ranch classes at shows as well as be useful in daily trail or ranch riding.

SHOWMANSHIP: This is a educational show class to use as preparation for the fair and to utilize the knowledge learned at horse camp.

EQUINE VET DEMO: Instruction will be given on tips for vaccinating your horse.

FARRIER CARE: Learn the basics of hoof care and anatomy.

The following sessions will be elective workshops and will be worked in with the other sessions to keep class sizes small at camp sign-in campers will get to choose their elective workshops. These classes are subject to change by horse camp and other elective classes may be added to the list. More information will be available at horse camp sign-in.

HORSES INSIDE OUT: Paint the skeletal system and muscles onto a horse to learn the anatomy and locomotion of the horse. Witness the muscles as they work to help the horse move and carry a rider.

BRAIDING & SHOW PREP: Learn fun braids for your horse's mane and tale. The presenters will also go through show prep and the "tricks of the trade" when it comes to horse showing.

ROPING & PACKING: During these workshops learn the basics of roping and packing to assist you on your next horse adventure whether on the ranch or in the backcountry.
