How to use the Lawn Problem Solver

This program will help you diagnose AND find solutions to bluegrass lawn problems. Your diagnosis is based on making a series of choices about the appearance of your lawn problem.

Make your choices based on both the pictures and brief text provided. Choose the option that most closely resembles your lawn problem. You may have to make as many as seven choices in progressing through the "decision tree." Each choice eliminates some causes, so be patient in reaching the final choice to find your diagnosis. Note that you can always return to the beginning screen and check alternative choices by pressing the "Home" button. The "Back" button returns you to your previous choice.

After you have made your diagnosis, use the "More Info" button to find additional description and recommendation information on the cause and ways to manage your lawn problem. Remember that certain problems mimic each other and diagnosis depends on accurately differentiating symptoms. Want further information on your problem? Searches can be done on specific lawn problem subjects from the main, "Home" screen. The "Search for information" button allows you to begin your search.
